


Snow & Blowing Snow Thursday; Turning Much Colder

Message of the Day:



- Accumulating snow expected to move in late Thursday morning into the afternoon; may briefly start as a mix
- Snow will pick up in intensity through mid-eve with accums of 3-5", especially north central IL and the northern Chicago suburbs
- Blowing snow likely Thursday night into Friday significantly reducing visibility in open places & making for hazardous travel
- Very cold expected Friday into Monday; wind chills below zero



Important Forecast Changes

Winter Storm Watch issued for Boone, Lee, Ogle, and Winnebago Counties for Thursday mid-late afternoon through Friday morning

Snow & Blowing Snow Thursday; Turning Much Colder Key Points



Hazards: Wintry precip. develops Thursday with accumulating snow and blowing snow Thu PM-night, along with possible hazardous, icy roads; Dangerous cold & additional snow possible over the weekend-early next week.



Areas Impacted: Area wide, with impactful accumulating snow and blowing snow Thu PM-Fri AM favored especially north of I-80 in northern Illinois.



Timing & Duration:

Snow: Start Mid Thu AM (possibly mixed w/freezing rain), heavier Thu PM Blowing snow: Late day Thursday through Friday morning Icy Roads (Flash Freeze Potential): Thursday evening into Fri. AM Dangerous Cold: Friday through Monday; especially Sat. night into Mon.



Impacts: Hazardous road conditions with the snow and blowing snow, and roads becoming icy. Increased risk of cold related health hazards and increased risk of freeze-up ice jams on rivers during the upcoming cold snap.




Certainty & Considerations: Increasingly high confidence in a few to several inches of snow I-80 and north, but lower confidence on timing any freezing rain and exact timing of any start as rain or mix to all snow. High confidence in some travel impacts into Friday morning, lower though in magnitude of impacts and how much of area affected



Historical Perspective: The upcoming cold weather will be the coldest since late January 2019, but unlikely to be that extreme.

Snow & Blowing Snow Thursday; Turning Much Colder NWS Headlines for this Afternoon - Early Wednesday Morning



NWS Headline Definitions

- Winter Storm Watch issued for north central and northwest Illinois for the combination of accumulating snow and potential significant blowing snow Thursday mid-late afternoon into Thursday evening, and then blowing snow continuing into Friday morning.
- Winter Weather Advisory likely for at least a part if not much of the area

What:



Wind gusts to 30-40 mph



Wind Chills <-10°F



Where: Area-wide




When: Wind gusts Thursday night into Friday morning
Wind chills near -10°F Friday morning & <=10°F Saturday
morning & Saturday night-Monday morning




Confidence: High

Snow & Blowing Snow Thursday; Turning Much Colder Key Points

Minimum Wind Chill Sat. Night-Sun. AM



Minimum Wind Chill Sun. Night-Mon. AM



Forecast Lows: -10° to +2°
Locally colder possible in outlying areas



Certainty & Considerations: Confidence in sub-zero lows and wind chills is high. However, confidence in the exact temperature and lowest wind chills forecast is only low-medium. Multiple fast moving disturbances from Saturday PM through Monday could bring rounds of fluffy snow and least cloud cover if some areas miss the snow. This lowers confidence in how low the air temperatures and minimum wind chills will get. It's possible the coldest temperatures and wind chills get delayed due to the possible active pattern.
