

Strong Winds Tonight With Lakeshore Flooding



Weather Message of the Day:

- Strong winds likely this evening and overnight
 - Main time window of concern: 7pm tonight thru 5 am Friday
 O Strongest winds after 9pm IL, after 11pm IN (CDT)
- Lakeshore Flooding Impacts this evening-Friday morning
- Moderate to Heavy Rain a few embedded thunderstorms SE of I-57. Rainfall amounts up to 1-2"

NEW

Important Forecast Changes

This is the first SITREP for this event. An update may be issued this afternoon if needed.





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Hazards:

Strong winds and lakeshore flooding, along with ponding on some roads



Areas Impacted:

Areas mainly along and SE of I-55, especially areas along the lakeshore



Timing & Duration: This evening into early Friday morning



Impacts: Objects blown around, tree damage, power outages, hazardous travel for high profile vehicles, lakeshore flooding impacts



Certainty & Considerations: The top end magnitude of the northerly wind gusts will be affected by the exact track and strength of the surface low pressure this evening, which remains a bit uncertain. Also affected will be the placement of the heaviest rainfall axis. Duration and magnitude of the strongest winds will also determine the magnitude of the lakeshore flooding impacts.

Strong Winds Expected Tonight

WHAT

• Tree damage, possible power outages, objects & tents blown around, and hazardous travel due to 45-55+ mph gusts from north to northwest

WHEN

• This evening and overnight, strongest after 9PM

WHERE

• Strongest winds southeast of I-55 and near the lakeshore

ACTIONS

- Secure outdoor objects, including tents
- Use extra caution when driving, especially if operating a high profile vehicle on W-E roads
- Continue to stay tuned for forecast updates!

Lakeshore Flooding Possible Tonight

Stay off Trails, Piers, and Rocks along the Shore

WHAT

Inundation of parks, trails, and roads along the lakeshore due to a lake level rise caused by strong north winds along with large waves to 8 to 14 feet (IL Shore) and 12 to 16 feet (IN shore)

WHEN

Late this evening through Friday morning

ACTIONS

✓ Avoid any flooded roads, lakeshore parks, trails, breakwalls, and structures such as piers and jetties.

 \checkmark Protect property from rising water levels.

Lakeshore Flooding Impacts

Additional Information:

- Strong northerly winds tonight will result in lakeshore flooding impacts along the Lake Michigan shore
- Greatest impacts expected across the Indiana Shore. Upgrade to Lakeshore Flood Warning may need to be considered for Lake (IN) & Porter.



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Strong Winds Tonight With Lakeshore Flooding

Moderate to Heavy Rain Potential



Additional Information:

- Moderate to heavy rain is expected late this afternoon through tonight.
- Rainfall amounts generally in the 1 to 2" range are possible before rain comes to an end early Friday morning.
- This may result in ponding on area roadways and river/stream rises.
- A few embedded thunderstorms are possible, mainly southeast of I-57 this evening





Strong Winds Tonight With Lakeshore Flooding Outdoor Health Facility-Specific Information

What:



Winds from north to northwest of 20-35 mph, gusts of 35-55 mph could compromise tent structures



Where: Strongest winds/gusts near Lake MI in northeast IL & across east-central Illinois and northwest Indiana



When: Tonight, strongest winds after 9pm



Confidence: High in 20+ mph sustained winds & 30+ mph gusts

High Wind Facts and Preparedness

Quick facts you should know about High Winds

-Wind gusts of 50-60 mph could cause some tree limbs to be blown down, as well as cause sporadic power outages. -These winds will likely compromise outdoor tent structures.

-Driving high profile vehicles can be very dangerous.

Preparedness

-A **Wind Advisory** means that sustained winds (not associated with thunderstorms) of 30 to 39 mph and/or gusts between 45-57 mph are expected for a duration of at least 1 hour.

-A **High Wind Warning** means that sustained winds (not associated with thunderstorms) of 40 mph or greater, and/or gusts in excess of 58 mph are expected for a duration of a least 1 hour.

-A **High Wind Watch** means that sustained winds (not associated with thunderstorms) of 40 mph or greater, and/or gusts in excess of 58 mph are <u>possible</u> for a duration of a least 1 hour.

-Use extra caution when driving, especially if operating a high profile vehicle.

-Secure outdoor objects
