Highlights

- Remnants of Tropical Storm Cristobal brings very windy conditions and locally heavy rainfall Tue-Tue Ngt.
- Wind gusts 40-50 mph possible.

Weather Message of the Day:

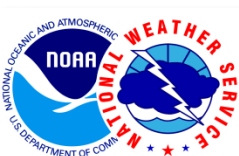


- Strong, possibly damaging, winds likely late Tuesday afternoon into the evening, then again Wednesday.
- Small risk of brief tornadoes & locally damaging winds with storms Tuesday afternoon & evening.
- Torrential downpours with a limited flash flood risk Tuesday afternoon & evening.

Important Forecast Changes



Storm track may be shifting slightly east, with slightly higher rain amounts possible across north central IL as compared to previous forecast. SPC has introduced slight risk of severe storms.

Timeline of Strongest Winds

3 PM-12 AM CDT Tuesday

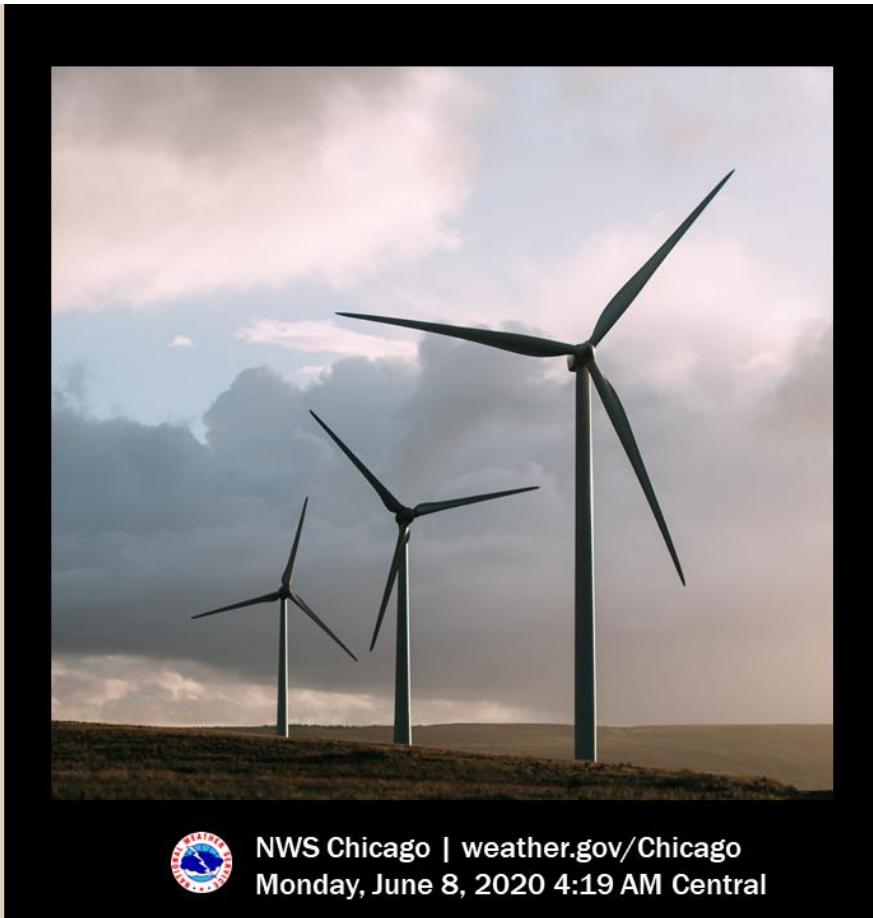
- Gusts up to 40-50 mph (medium-high confidence)
- Small threat for gusts up to 50-60+ mph
- Direction (from): Southeast shifting to southwest

9 AM-5 PM CDT Wednesday

- Gusts up to 40-50 mph (medium confidence)
- Direction (from): Southwest to west

Hazards

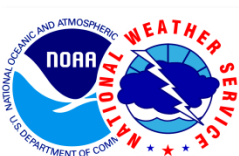
- Loose objects and tents may be blown around
- Tree damage and power outages possible
- Difficult to hazardous travel for high profile vehicles

Certainty & Considerations: Two periods of strong, potentially damaging, winds, first late Tuesday afternoon and evening, then again Wednesday.



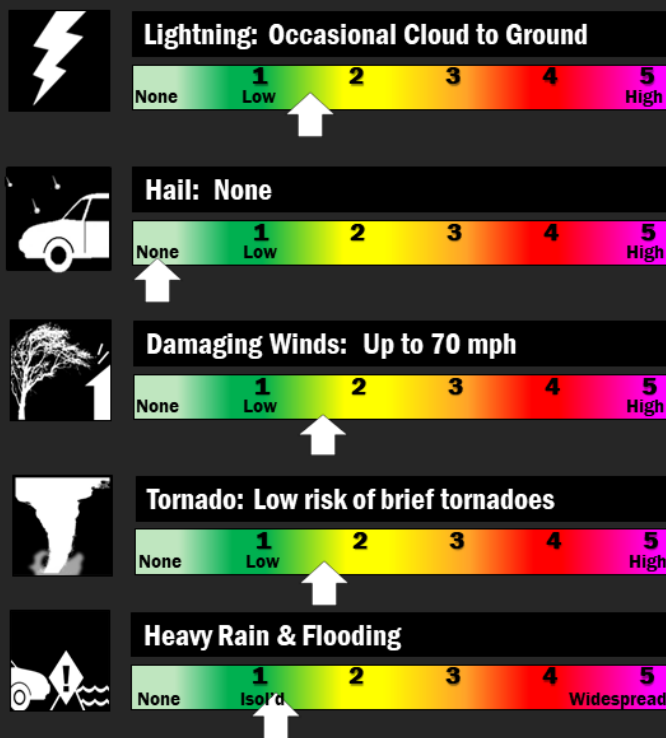
Thunderstorm Threat

Small Chance of Severe Thunderstorms Tuesday

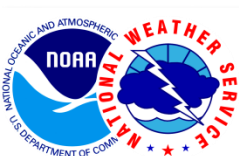
Forecast Details

- Bands of showers & isolated T-storms from Cristobal will impact entire region Tuesday afternoon & evening
- If sufficient instability develops, isolated storms could become severe
- If severe threat develops, primary risks would be:
 - Brief tornadoes
 - Localized wind damage
- Overall severe risk at this time appears low, but monitor later forecasts

Hazards: Likelihood/Risk Level



Certainty & Considerations: Low confidence in severe thunderstorm potential Tuesday afternoon and evening.



Heavy Rainfall Threat

Heavy Rain Potential Tuesday PM

HIGHLIGHTS

Fast moving showers and isolated t-storms likely Tuesday afternoon and evening.

Heavier showers & storms will produce brief, but torrential, downpours (rainfall rates similar to May 17th)

Widespread flooding not expected, but pockets of road ponding and localized flooding possible.

WHERE

Northern Illinois, with highest threat for localized flooding in green and especially yellow shaded areas on map, west of an Evanston to Pontiac line.

WHEN

Tuesday afternoon and evening.

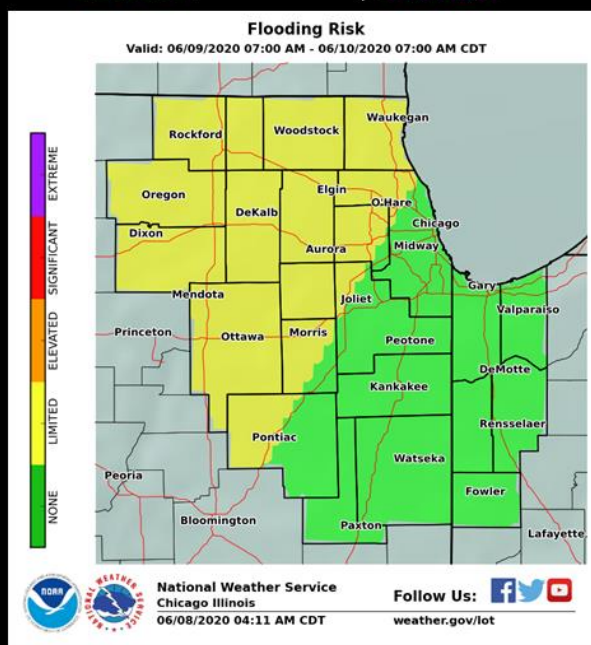
ACTION

Monitor the latest forecasts for updates.

LOWEST → HIGHEST

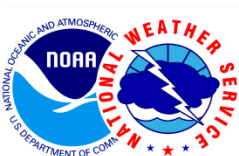

Certainty & Considerations: High confidence in torrential rain producing showers and storms. Medium confidence duration will be brief enough to keep flash flood threat on lower end of spectrum.

WPC Excessive Rainfall Day 2 outlook has shifted slight risk a bit farther to the east since yesterday.
